Enter all final hours into the UKG Timesheet and approve for the final pay check processing.



Ice cream using Cal Poly Pomona grown ingredients is coming to campus and is currently in its final stages of product development!

On Thursday, February 16th, Cal Poly Pomona Enterprise Foundation Dining Services hosted a free sampling event in the campus quad. Students had the opportunity to taste ice cream using CPP grown ingredients and sample the type of fruit used in its manufacturing, courtesy of the Farm Store.

Featured ice cream flavors were Guava Cheesecake, Satsuma Mandarin and Avocado. Fresh avocados, satsuma mandarins and cara cara oranges grown here at Cal Poly Pomona Farms were used to make the ice cream in collaboration with a local creamery.

CPP Farms Ice Cream is credited to Aaron Fox's Farm to Table class and CPP Enterprise Foundation's Dining Services Culinary Development Department students. The final product is being developed in partnership with CPP Enterprise Foundation and students from various campus areas, such as the College of Agriculture.



How to complete the Payment Request Webform in OneSolution

Follow the numberrs in the screenshot below to the instructions as detailed after:



How to complete the Payment Request Webform in OneSolution Cont.

- 1. Invoice Date: Enter the date as provided on invoice
- **2. Vendor**: Enter the vendor name to search for the vendor # starting with F or R; If the vendor # doesn't exist in the system, please send an email to foundationap@cpp.edu for setting up a new vendor #.
- 3. Invoice No.: Enter the invoice number as provided on the invoice
- **4.** Address: Use the remit address as provided on invoice; Choose the drop-down menu if different Address Type is available.
- **5. Due Date**: Default as system date; Ex. If an invoice is due on 4/1/2023, you would enter 3/30/2023 as the Due Date (Wednesday Check Run), not 4/1/2023 in the Due Date field.
- 6. PO No: Enter PO # if available.
- 7. Full/Partial Day: Enter F for Fully Paid or P for Partial Pay if available.
 - a. Divison Cd: GENERAL DIVISION CODE default
 - b. Post Date: Default as system date
- 8. Separate Check: Check mark the box if payment needs to be separated especially for utilities bill
- 9. **Project**: Enter Project # (XXXXXX)
- 10. **Object**: Enter Object code (7xxx)
- 11. **Description**: Enter the purpose/description
- 12. Amount: Enter the amount provided on invoice
- 13. Enter Additional Description/Persons Attending/Purpose and Benefits to University and/or Foundation if needed
- 14. Add Attachment: Attach the invoice from the directory for the supporting document
- 15. Submit: Click Submit and RE# will be generated

- 4 Mandarin Oranges


Directions
