On Wednesday, August 15 the American Red Cross ran 40 blood drives in Southern California. SCE was the #1 collector of blood for the day with 116 units!

On Thursday, August 16 the American Red Cross ran 36 blood drives in Southern California and once again, SCE was #1 with 110 units of blood collected (UCLA took second place with 85 units collected for the day.) As you

can see, nobody came close to the number of units you collected in back to back days. Your blood drives in the past two days will be able to help save 678 lives! In my 13 years at the American Red Cross, I have never had a blood drive collect 226 units of blood in two days. Thank you so much once again!”

# Celebrate the Holidays with Festive Cookie Bars!

## INGREDIENTS

### FOR THE COOKIE BARS:

3/4 c. unsalted butter, softened  
1 c. lightly packed brown sugar  
1 large egg  
3 tbsp. molasses  
2 1/4 c. all-purpose flour  
2 1/2 tsp. ground ginger  
1 tsp. cinnamon  
1/4 tsp. nutmeg  
Pinch of cloves  
1 tsp. baking soda  
1/4 tsp. kosher salt

### FOR THE FROSTING:

1/2 c. unsalted butter, at room temperature  
2 c. powdered sugar  
5 tbsp. Caramel  
Sprinkles

## DIRECTIONS (serves 9-12)

1. Preheat oven to 350° and line a 9"-x-9" baking dish with foil along the bottom and up the sides.
2. Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy, three to four minutes. Add egg and molasses and beat until well combined.
3. In another bowl, whisk together flour, ginger, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves, baking soda and salt, then add to wet ingredients and mix until smooth. Refrigerate dough for 30 minutes.
4. Evenly spread dough into prepared pan and bake until lightly golden, 18 to 20 minutes. Remove from oven and let cool in pan. When completely cool, remove bars from pan.
5. To make frosting: Beat butter until smooth. Add powdered sugar and mix until smooth, then add caramel and mix until smooth.
6. Spread frosting onto bars and top with sprinkles. Cut into squares and serve. Store in an airtight container up to four days.
