## David Prenovost, CFO and Senior Managing Director

- Welcomed the group to the fall All Hands Meeting
- Financial and Employment Services Focus Group Meeting is December 13, 2018 at 9:00 a.m.
- An executive search has begun for a new Executive Director. A search committee has formed with plans to have a new Executive Director in place by July 1, 2019.
- A new philanthropic organization has formed. They will hold all spendable scholarships and will be working with the Advancement team. The Foundation will gift about 130 million to the new philanthropic organization – we will need board approval to gift/“transfer” the funds. The Foundation will be doing the accounting and other services for the organization.
- The new Foundation Executive Director will not be the Executive Director of the new philanthropic organization



## Aaron Neilson, Director of Dining Services

- Dining Services has made 22 million in revenue to date
- Highlighted Kellogg House for their 1 million dollars in revenue; Over 70 weddings this year
- Saddles Cafe is up 132% in revenue and is using all in-house brands
- New dining commons coming in January 2020
- Announced new promotions and employees



## Cameron Edmonds, Kellogg West

- Announced that Kellogg West is having a good year, and he could not do it without his team



## Dennis Miller, Chief Employment Officer

- Stated that the Foundation has had a good year in revenue
- Going to approach board about a possible 3% pay increase
- Foundation's healthcare plan has been upgraded
- There is no longer an EPO plan, and we are currently exploring adding a new PPO plan in January 2020
- We had three retirees this year; Barbara Santillian (20 years), Debra Poe (21 years) and Sherry Flamino (31 years)
- Board approved December 24 as a paid Foundation holiday; A vacation day must be used for December 31
- Please be safe during the holidays



Edwin Santiago, Director of Marketing

- Shared two marketing videos; Foundation Family Photo Day slideshow and University Village campaign video for student leaders
- Introduced Bronco Global campaign that will be showcased at the end of January 2019
- Tapingo App has had over 40,000 transactions with the help of Foundation Marketing



Sandy Vaughan-Acton, Director of Real Estate

- Recognized Adriana Carreon-Ducoulombier for receiving her CPM and being awarded CPM of the Year
- Faculty Staff Housing Program is doing well
- There are two homes currently for sale, and an email has gone out to faculty and staff. A lot of interest in the homes has been shown.
- 1.2 million dollars in revenue is brought in through SCE and American Red Cross
- Campus South has generated 3.4 million dollars in film revenue since 2015
- University is working with Five Point to come up with concepts to develop Campus South
