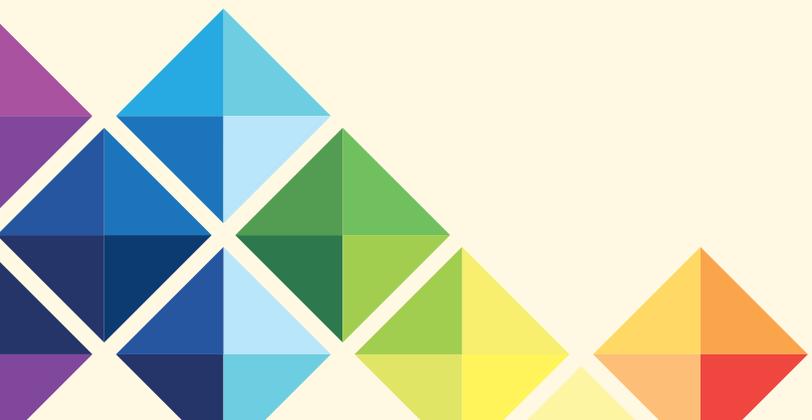



This scholarship is made possible through the Foundation Dining Services beverage contract with the Pepsi Bottling Group.



Collins College full-time undergrads who work in Foundation Dining Services or at Kellogg West Conference Center & Hotel are eligible applicants as long as they maintain a minimum of 2.5 GPA. Candidates are required to submit a completed Collins College application, a current resume and a one-page response to the question “How will your work experience in Foundation Dining Services or at Kellogg West enhance your career opportunities?” The Collins College Scholarship Committee reviews all submitted materials and selects a minimum of five students. The minimum amount of this non-renewable award is \$500.
